The Ascension of the Lord.

The Bible says that after he rose from the dead, Jesus remained on Earth for a further 40 days before he was lifted into the clouds to return to his Father in Heaven—the event is known as the Ascension.

On this day, Jesus and his loyal followers were gathered at a place called the Mount of Olives.

A short time before, Jesus was already giving his disciples instructions to prepare them for when he went away. He told them not to leave Jerusalem right away, but to wait for a special gift from God. Even though the disciples didn't fully understand what was going to happen, they would have known that they needed to follow Jesus' words.

You know how in a relay race, one person hands the baton to another person so that they can continue the race for their team? Well, some people look at the Day of Ascension as Jesus passing the baton on to his followers. It was now up to them to tell others about everything they'd seen and learnt from Jesus.

Even though Jesus was returning to Heaven, it was clear that he was not abandoning his disciples. According to promises made in the Bible, Christians to this day believe God never leaves or abandons His followers. Jesus' words on the Day of Ascension are a reminder of that.

Short Reflection on this weeks Gospel—John 15 v 9-17

You did not choose me," Jesus said to his disciples in today's gospel reading, "but I chose you." And it's true. Jesus chose his disciples. And when he did, he was continuing a long tradition that we see throughout scripture, and throughout the history of the church, of God choosing unlikely people to accomplish surprising tasks.

Let's go back to Genesis. There are many examples of people being chosen by God for surprising tasks, people like Noah, and Abraham and Sarah. But lets look at Joseph. One of Jacob's twelve sons, and the one that Jacob loved most. The one with the coat of many colours. The one the other brothers hated so much that they sold him to some people headed for Egypt. Joseph unexpectedly became quite successful in Egypt, and after a long journey with many twists and turns, including time in prison after being unjustly accused, Joseph became second only to Pharoah, and helped Egypt prepare for a great famine. Why? Well, God had a plan for Joseph. As he explained to his brothers, "Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good, in order to preserve a numerous people, as he is doing today." Joseph was chosen by God to preserve God's chosen people.

Chosen by God: Jesus' Disciples

Jesus was continuing a long tradition, started by his heavenly Father, of making surprising choices to do God's work. And the disciples were no different. Fishermen, tax collectors, not a religious leader among them. No experts in God's teachings, no scholars. They only had one thing going for them: Jesus chose them.

Those disciples were chosen by God's Son for a particular purpose in this world. But they're not the only ones. In fact, if scripture tells us anything, it is that each and every one of us has also been chosen by God for a particular purpose in this world. We have been chosen to bear the fruit of God's love in this world, and to bear it in a way that no one else can.

The words that Jesus spoke to those first disciples, he speaks to every one of us today: "You did not choose me, but I chose you, and appointed you to go and bear fruit."


