

Short Reflection on this weeks Gospel - John 16 v 12-15

During the poignant Last Supper, Jesus tenderly addresses His disciples, preparing them for His imminent departure and the coming of the Holy Spirit. In John 16:12-15, Jesus speaks with a profound understanding of His followers' limitations, acknowledging, "I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear." This statement reveals Jesus' compassion for their current state of comprehension and emotional readiness, highlighting the gradual unfolding of divine truth to receptive hearts. It underscores the gentle and patient manner in which God reveals His mysteries to humanity, respecting our capacity to receive and understand.

Moreover, Jesus promises the disciples that the Holy Spirit, referred to as the "Spirit of truth," will come to guide them into all truth. This description illuminates the Spirit's pivotal role in unveiling and clarifying God's eternal truths to believers. The continuous and progressive nature of this guidance emphasizes the ongoing revelation of divine wisdom to those who are open to receiving it. The Holy Spirit's teachings are not independent but perfectly aligned with the will of the Father and the teachings of Jesus, reflecting the unity within the Trinity and the Spirit's prophetic function in communicating God's plans.

Furthermore, Jesus elucidates that the Holy Spirit will glorify Him by imparting the truths received from Him to the disciples. This declaration underscores the centrality of Jesus in the divine plan of salvation and the Spirit's mission to exalt Christ through His revelations. The unity and shared purpose within the Trinity are emphasized in Jesus' affirmation that all that belongs to the Father is His, and the Spirit will receive from Him to make known to the disciples. This statement reinforces the inseparable bond and divine authority among the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, highlighting their unified mission to redeem and enlighten humanity.

The unity and purpose within the Trinity, along with the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in glorifying Jesus and revealing God's truth, serve as a foundational truth for believers to navigate life's complexities with divine wisdom and insight.

Parent/Governor vacancy at ST.Anthony's School.


